Subject: Request for installation of a traffic signal at My Home Ankura–RR7 Junction

Respected Sir/Madam,

On behalf of Service for Society (S4S) and residents of communities along RR7, we respectfully request the urgent installation of a traffic signal at the My Home Ankura–RR7 Junction to regulate vehicle movement and improve public safety.

This junction has become increasingly busy because of rapid residential development, hospital traffic, school transportation, and growing daily commuter movement. During the last year, multiple accidents and near-miss incidents involving residents from our community and the nearby Tridasa community have been reported to us. These incidents have created serious concern among residents about the continuing risk at this location.

The junction has blind spots and limited visibility for vehicles entering, exiting, or crossing RR7. Drivers often struggle to assess the speed and direction of approaching vehicles, particularly during peak hours. In the absence of a signal-controlled right of way, vehicles are forced to merge or cross through moving traffic, increasing the possibility of collisions. Pedestrians, senior citizens, children, two-wheeler riders, and vehicles accessing My Home Ankura are especially vulnerable.

Traffic volume is expected to rise further as additional residential communities become occupied along RR7. The current arrangement is therefore inadequate for the present conditions and will become increasingly unsafe without timely traffic-management intervention.

In the interest of public safety, we request the Traffic Police to:

- Conduct an immediate traffic, visibility, and accident-risk assessment at the My Home Ankura–RR7 Junction.
- Install a traffic signal to regulate crossing and merging traffic and reduce the risk of further accidents.
- Provide marked pedestrian crossings, stop lines, warning signs, reflective road markings, and suitable street lighting.
- Assess the need for speed-calming measures and temporary traffic-police deployment until the signal becomes operational.

A traffic signal and supporting safety measures at this junction would address the blind-spot risk, establish a clear right of way, improve pedestrian safety, and help prevent avoidable injuries and loss of life. We respectfully request an early field inspection and priority action before growing traffic makes the junction more hazardous.

Service for Society and local residents are ready to support the Traffic Police with community feedback, accident observations, photographs, peak-hour traffic information, and coordination for a site assessment. We sincerely request your kind intervention and timely action.
